



2025 ANNUAL REPORT



A YEAR OF CHALLENGES, COMPASSION & COMMITMENT

As we reflect on 2025, it is impossible to ignore the unprecedented challenges facing animal welfare organizations across our region. Throughout the year, local shelters experienced record numbers of dog and cat surrenders, while rescues—including One Love Animal Rescue—faced overwhelming capacity limitations. Foster homes became increasingly difficult to secure, veterinary resources remained stretched, and the demand for lifesaving assistance far exceeded the available space and support systems.

Like many rescues nationwide, we were forced to make difficult decisions regarding intake. With foster homes full and shelters operating beyond capacity, every new rescue request had to be carefully evaluated on a case-by-case basis. While this meant we could not say “yes” to every animal in need, we remained committed to helping wherever and however we could.

Despite these obstacles, One Love Animal Rescue continued to make a meaningful impact throughout our community by:

- Providing education, resources, and pet retention support through our **Operation Pet Solutions** community outreach program.
- Continued fundraising efforts to provide critical medical care, emergency treatments, vaccinations, and spay/neuter services for the animals in our care.
- Participating in free vaccine and microchip clinics with **Chatham-90** and our partner, **Chatham Subaru**, to help keep pets in the community healthy and prevent unnecessary shelter intake.
- Hosting weekly adoption events and meet-and-greet opportunities to connect animals in our care with loving families.
- Coordinating transports to trusted rescue partners, helping move animals to areas with greater adoption opportunities and lifesaving resources.
- Partnering with students and professors from **SCAD SERVE** on a strategic rebranding initiative to strengthen our outreach and community engagement efforts.
- Launching a much-needed website redesign to improve accessibility, streamline applications, and better serve adopters, fosters, volunteers, and donors.

While we are proud of what we accomplished together, the need continues to grow. The single greatest challenge facing our organization is the shortage of foster homes. Every available foster directly translates into lives saved. We also urgently need dedicated volunteers who can assist with transporting animals to veterinary appointments, helping at adoption events, and serving as animal handlers during community outreach activities.

Looking ahead, we remain hopeful. Every adoption, every foster home, every volunteer hour, and every donation creates a pathway to safety for an animal in need. The compassion of our supporters has allowed us to navigate one of the most difficult years our rescue community has faced, and together we will continue building solutions that keep pets with their families, provide second chances for homeless animals, and strengthen animal welfare throughout Coastal Georgia.

Thank you for standing beside us, believing in our mission, and helping us create a future where every animal has the opportunity to be loved, protected, and given a second chance.

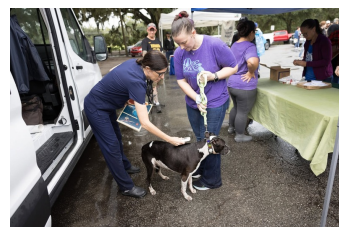
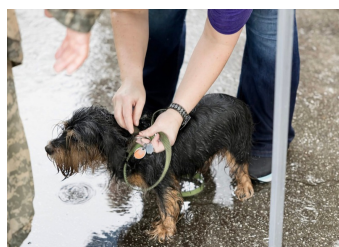

- Animals Vaccinated: 81

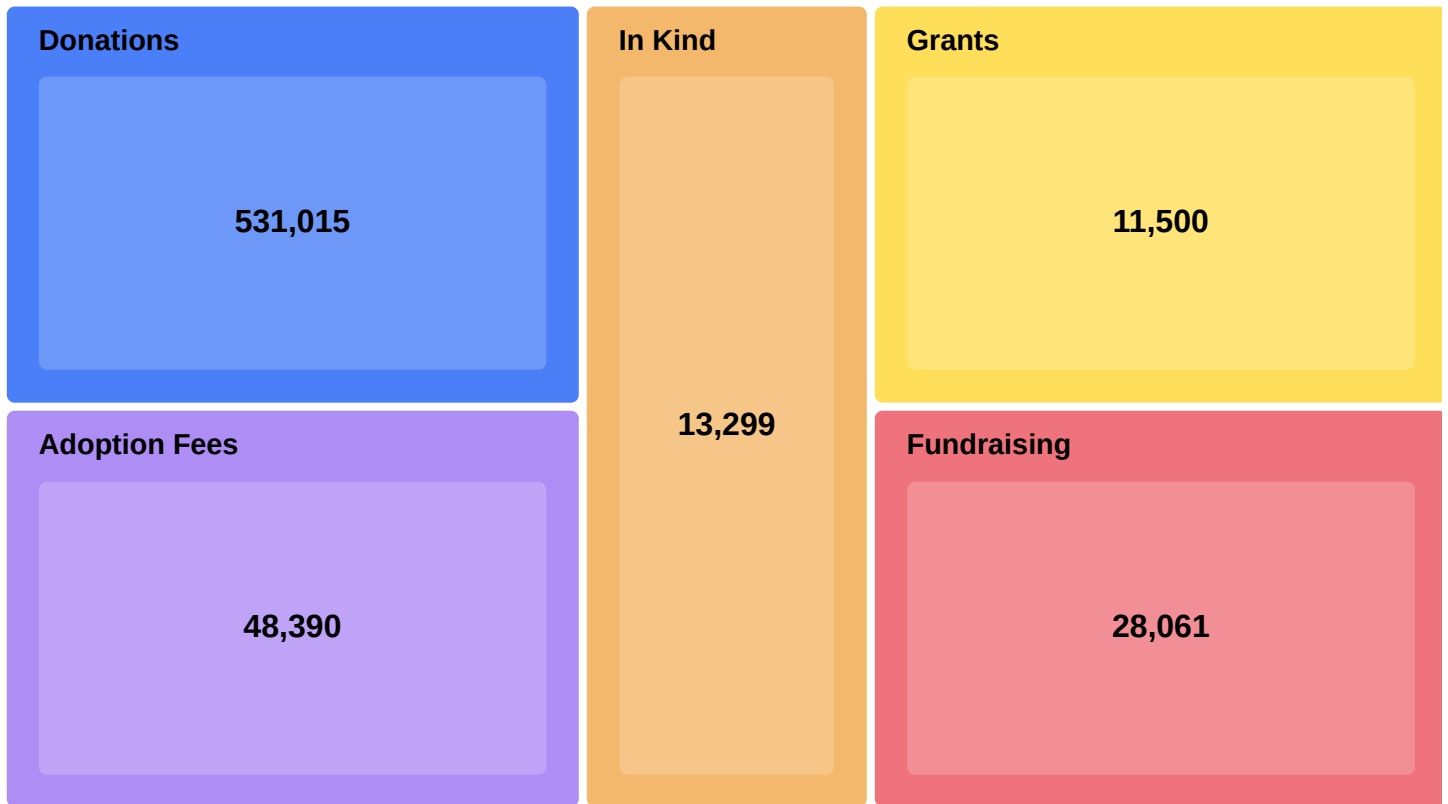

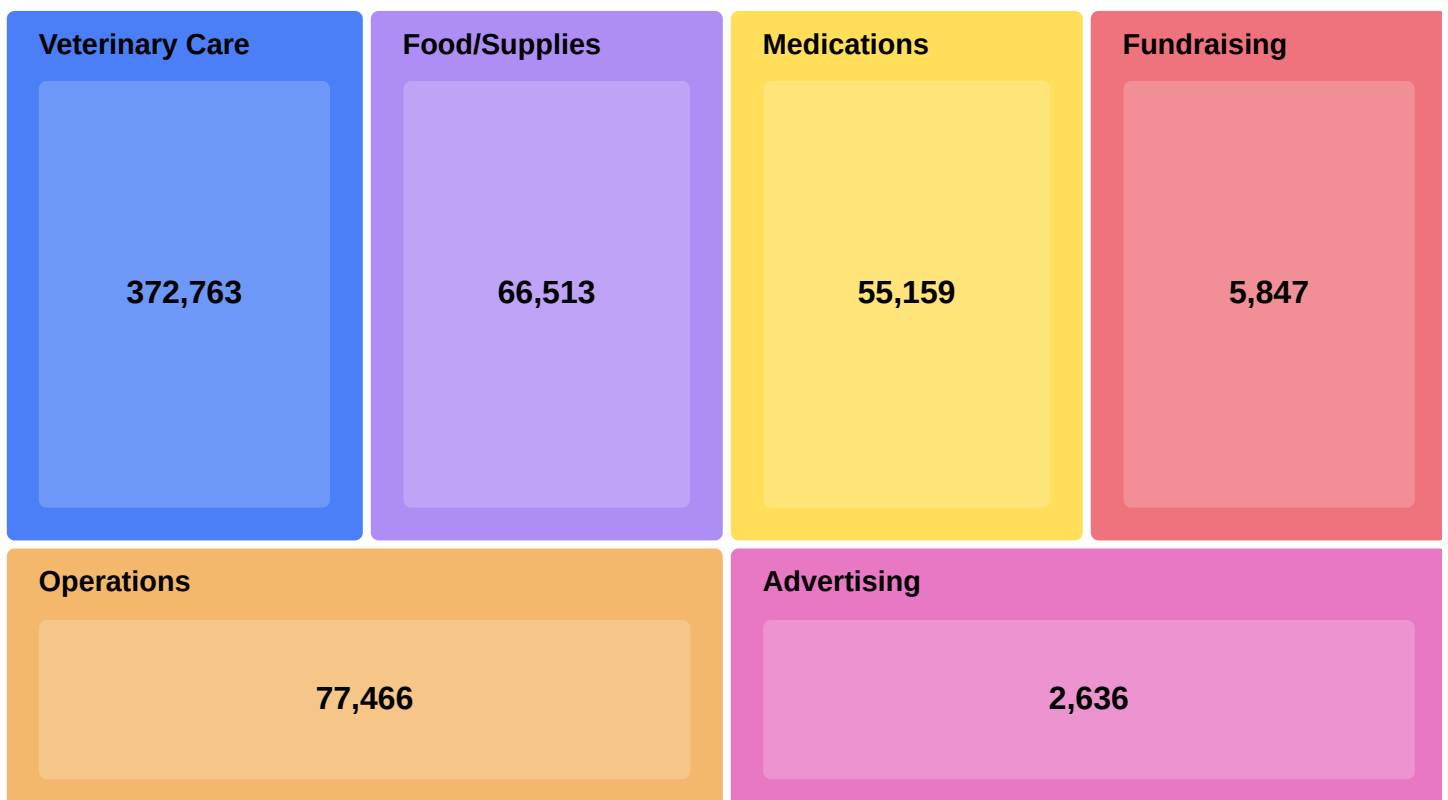
2025 Total Income

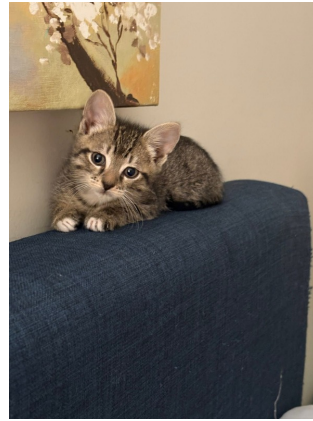
\$624,265
